

Chair's message

This year brought the highly anticipated opening of the Blacktown Exercise Sport and Technology Hub (BEST) and The Lodge. BEST was designed to provide residents and sportspeople with access to the highest quality health and fitness facilities and services. It has given us great pleasure to welcome the Australian Catholic University, Sydney West Sports Medicine, WentWest and Delaware North as partners in this ground-breaking project. The Lodge has provided much-needed accommodation at Blacktown International Sports Park and created a one stop shop for athletes, teams and tourists to experience the best of Western Sydney.

Our aquatic and leisure centres have once again proven to be the 'go to' places for our residents and visitors. More than 1.7 million people passed through the doors of our 5 venues to swim, splash, exercise and dance, play tennis or kick a ball.

My fellow directors and I are grateful to the fantastic staff who remain committed to providing the highest quality of service and facilities. I would like to extend my thanks for their dedication to delivering to such a high standard. They are an immense source of pride to my fellow directors and I.

I pay tribute to my colleagues on the BVM board and thank them for their unwavering support.

I thank the team at Blacktown City Council for its continued support. And finally, I would like to thank BVM CEO, Kevin Jones, and congratulate the leadership team on another successful year.

Vale Mayor Tony Bleasdale OAM

1946-2024

This year we lost a great visionary, a champion of Western Sydney and long-standing chairman of BVM – Tony Bleasdale OAM.

Tony passed away suddenly on the return flight home after leading a delegation to Blacktown City Council's sister cities in South Korea and China. He was 77.

Tony lived a life defined by service and deep commitment to his community. Born in Liverpool, England in 1946, Tony grew up in a post-war era marked by economic hardship. His father was a dockworker, and his early life was characterised by the challenges of growing up in a working-class family. At only 15, Tony migrated to Australia under the Big Brother Movement in search of better opportunities. This movement brought British boys to Australia for a new start.

After arriving in 1963, Tony settled in Shalvey and began work as a bricklayer. As his career evolved, he became a union official and eventually the managing director of National Contractors, a successful construction industry group. However, his true passion was public service. He was elected a Councillor to Blacktown City in 1996.

Tony's dedication to Blacktown City and its people was evident in his many achievements. He was instrumental in driving transformational projects such as the Warrick Lane development, the Blacktown Exercise, Sport and Technology Hub (BEST) and the \$1 billion Blacktown Quarter project with Walker Corporation. His leadership always had a strong focus on community infrastructure, sustainability and cultural inclusivity. He was particularly passionate about improving the lives of disadvantaged constituents and advocating for First Nations people.

He was deeply loved and respected, not just for his public service but for the genuine care he showed everyone he met. As a migrant himself, Tony was keen to provide opportunities and support for new residents and wholeheartedly pushed for a united city that accepted and celebrated people of all backgrounds and cultures. His legacy is one of transformation, community building and a relentless pursuit of a better future for our City.

Tony's contributions were formally recognised in 2010 when he was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) for his service to the community and local government.

In 2019, he was elected Mayor of Blacktown City.

Tony was key in helping BVM navigate the COVID pandemic and his dynamic personality helped deliver landmark projects at Blacktown International Sports Park including the AFL/cricket precinct, the Western Sydney Wanderers Centre of Football and, as previously mentioned, the \$100 million BEST. Tony served as a Director of Blacktown Venue Management from 2010 and led the Board as Chairman from 2019.

Tony was known for his warmth, generosity and unwavering commitment to his community. We at BVM will miss his leadership, guidance and sharp sense of humour. Most of all, we will miss his deep love for the people who he came to know and who came to know him.

Vale Bill McNamara OAM

1927-2024

This year we lost a proud Riverstone man who contributed so much to the growth and development of Western Sydney – former BVM Director William (Bill) McNamara OAM.

Bill founded the McNamara Group in the 1950s and was instrumental in shaping the urban landscape of Western Sydney through his many building projects. His visionary developments included the Westpoint Shopping Centre in Blacktown, Riverstone Marketown, the McNamara Centre and Riverside Theatres at Parramatta, and many other significant projects.

Bill's connection to Western Sydney went far beyond construction. He was a passionate advocate for sport and served the Riverstone Rugby League Club in several capacities, as well as being a Trustee for Parramatta Stadium. Bill was also Chairman of St Gabriel's School for Deaf Children for 30 years, and Chairman of the Economic Development Board of Greater Western Sydney.

Bill served as an independent Director of BVM from 2002 to 2016. His commitment to fostering community spirit and unwavering support for local initiatives has left an indelible mark on our organisation and beyond.

Bill was a man of remarkable character, known for his generosity, leadership and extraordinary commitment to his family and the community. His legacy lives on in the landscape and success of Western Sydney.



Blacktown Venue Management Ltd is committed to work health and safety and follows Blacktown City Council's Work Health and Safety Policy as best practice. This policy recognises due diligence must apply in managing and providing a safe and healthy workplace for all workers and other persons.

In addition to the policy, all Key Venues leisure and aquatic facilities work closely with Royal Life Saving Australia and operate within the Guidelines for Safe Pool operations. Staff are required to attend regular training to ensure they are meeting the highest possible safety standards when working within the centres.

Our ongoing commitment to water safety and education is further demonstrated through the promotion of Royal Life Saving's 'Keep Watch @ Public Pools' initiative. This initiative has key messages for parents on how they need to supervise their children in an aquatic environment. These messages are displayed throughout all venues with additional multi-language signage targeted to the languages spoken most commonly by local residents.

We have also introduced an image based, easy to understand approach to signage, advertising free lifejackets available for patrons to borrow during their visit. The lifejackets were introduced as an additional safety measure for weak or non-confident swimmers of all ages, allowing them to feel more comfortable using the pools while also reducing the potential for drowning. Signage includes written and visual indicators of how to correctly fit and wear the lifejackets to ensure patrons are getting the maximum benefit out of the aids.

This year we continued to partner with Royal Life Saving NSW to deliver subsidised swimming lesson programs for at-risk members of the local community. Project Harmony, run in conjunction with Royal Life Saving NSW with additional financial support from the NSW Government's First Lappers vouchers, focused on providing swimming lessons for preschool aged children who had not been able to access lessons previously, either due to lack of availability or financial restrictions. This initiative was run at Blacktown Aquatic Centre, Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope and Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre for 10 weeks from April 2024, and was able to accommodate 64 students across the 3 venues.

Program highlights

- Swim Sense free water education program for adults held at Blacktown Aquatic Centre, Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope, Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton and Riverstone Swimming Centre.
- · Royal Life Saving Society Australia funded swimming program, Project Harmony, ran for 10 weeks at Blacktown Aquatic Centre, Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope and Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton.
- · Allianz Swim Club free 9-week adult swimming lesson program, run in partnership with Allianz Australia, was delivered at Blacktown Aquatic Centre and Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton.
- Direct debit payment system introduced to complement new perpetual swimming lesson program, moving away from previous term-based re-enrolment and payment system.



About the Program

The Aqua Learn to Swim program was offered at 4 of the Key Venues' centres this year. The program provides swimming lessons that cover all levels and abilities for students as young as 6 months all the way through to adults.

A range of additional programs were also offered this year, run in partnership with external organisations, with the aim of increasing the accessibility of swimming lessons for groups who face a higher risk of drowning.

Project Harmony, a Royal Life Saving NSW and NSW Government initiative, provided subsidised swimming lessons for preschool aged children with parents only needing to use their First Lap voucher to access the 10-week program. This program was a great success with 64 students across 3 of the aquatic and leisure centres.

Blacktown Aquatic Centre and Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton also worked in conjunction with Allianz Australia to deliver the Allianz Swim Club adult swimming lesson program. This free program was able to provide 31 adults across the local community with access to introductory swimming lessons designed to teach them basic water safety and survival skills.

About the centre

Currently in its 7th decade of operations, Blacktown Aquatic Centre has cemented its place in the history of Blacktown City. This centre, built by the late Bill McNamara OAM, continues to serve as the City's main competition pool with 44 school, zone and regional carnivals held during the year. The pools are also home to 7 swim clubs serving swimmers of all ages from beginners through to Olympic level competitors.

Over the past 12 months, Blacktown Aquatic Centre has demonstrated its commitment to providing high-quality facilities, services and customer experience. This dedication has been acknowledged through a range of awards for both the venue and its staff:

- The centre was awarded a 5-star score of 99% in Royal Life Saving's safety assessment.
- Marisa Zinghini and Marlee King both received National awards for their work as Aqua instructors at the venue.

Athletics

The Athletics Centre reopened fully this year following the closure of the infield area during the construction of the Blacktown Exercise Sports and Technology Hub facilities. Reconstruction works were undertaken on the playing surface of the infield during this period, with school carnivals having run in limited capacity on the brand-new MONDO track last year.

We were able to welcome back school and Little Athletics events at full capacity this year as well as resume access for our permit holders. The track and field facilities have served as the training and competition grounds for numerous sports since opening to the public and they continue to grow and provide further opportunities to the people of Blacktown City.






The facility offers a variety of aquatic and fitness options suitable for all, regardless of age or ability level.

Located in the heart of Mount Druitt, the Mount Druitt Swimming Centre has been a cherished part of the community for over 40 years. This popular seasonal pool offers a wide range of facilities and services to residents and visitors during the summer season.

The centre also received a renovation and upgrade with new seating installed to replace the old concrete grandstand overlooking the 50-metre pool.





Moreover, the centre serves as the summer home for the Riverstone Dolphins RSL Swimming Club, providing a venue for its training, championships, carnivals and presentations. During the season, Riverstone welcomed 3,468 Dolphins for its weekly club nights, helping to grow and strengthen the swimming community across Blacktown City.

The centre continues to be one of the most highly sought after venues for schools, hosting over 7,000 attendees across a range of Department of Education and Training and school-based learn-to-swim and lifesaving programs. Additionally, the centre catered for 20 school, zone and regional carnivals with 2,177 participants across the summer period.

A range of community-based initiatives were introduced this year to increase engagement with residents and visitors from across Blacktown City. Summer Sessions brought live music to the poolside over 2 weekends in January, celebrating the people and history of the area. The centre extended its operating hours during the peak of summer, staying open until 8pm every day to the end of summer season closing.

Pierce facility of the year award and Aquatics Supervisor, Andrew Vaulin, was a finalist for the Emerging Leader award. 
