Chairman's message

As I look back at my inaugural year as Chairman of Blacktown Venue Management Ltd (BVM) I am honoured to have led the BVM Board over the past year.

As a Board we are proud to be the custodians of facilities and services that are an integral part of our community. Blacktown Key Venues oversees 11 major sports and leisure facilities across the City: Blacktown Football Park (home of Blacktown District Soccer Football Association), Western Sydney Wanderers Centre of Football, Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney, Joe McAleer Oval (home of Blacktown Cricket Club), Rooty Hill Leisure Centre, Blacktown Tennis Centre Stanhope, Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope, Blacktown Aquatic Centre, Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton, Mount Druitt Swimming Centre and Riverstone Swimming Centre.

We play a major part in keeping our city healthy and active and it is something we are very passionate about. We are committed to providing the community with first class facilities, programs and activities across all levels of sport, leisure and recreation.

This commitment is demonstrated through the endorsement by Blacktown City Council of the Blacktown International Sportspark Master plan. A major component of the Master plan is the International Centre of Training Excellence (ICTE). We continue to develop the ICTE as a world-leading high-performance education, sports medicine and recovery facility. The ICTE will open in 2022. The ICTE will be the centrepiece for the future of Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney and will cement Blacktown as the sporting capital of Western Sydney.

This last year has had its challenges. The bushfire crisis started back in September 2019 and wasn't fully contained until February 2020. Due to poor air quality and to ensure the safety of our patrons our outdoor pools were forced to close on a number of occasions across this period. In late March 2020 the COVID-19 outbreak affected organisations all over the world. Consequently, all of our sports and leisure facilities closed to the public, only reopening in June 2020 as Government restrictions began to lift. On behalf of the Board I would like to thank the whole team at BVM for their continued commitment and dedication through this difficult period.

As Chairman of Blacktown Venue Management and on behalf of the Blacktown Venue Management Board of Directors it gives me great pleasure to welcome you to the 2019/2020 Blacktown Key Venues year in review.



The first half of 2020 also brought tragedy to our door. In late March we lost a valued colleague from Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton, Ms Dani Gordon, in a tragic accident. Dani's loss impacted all at BVM, Key Venues and throughout our wider Blacktown City Council family. On behalf of the Board and staff we offer our deepest condolences to Dani's family and colleagues.

This year we also lost a founding member of our BVM family, Mr Graeme Watson. Graeme was intimately involved with the creation of BVM post the 2000 Sydney Olympics and was a trusted advisor to the BVM Board in those early years. Graeme's contribution to maintaining the Olympic legacy in Blacktown is probably lesser known than his high-profile sports career as both an international cricketer and AFL player in the '60's and '70's. After retiring from sport Graeme carved out a very successful sports consultancy career and it is here that our paths crossed. Graeme's help in those early years was invaluable and is not lost on the current BVM Board. Thank you Graeme.

After what has been probably the most challenging year we have experienced I would like to acknowledge and thank my fellow Directors for their continued support, service and insight.

I would also like to acknowledge the ongoing support from Blacktown City Council, its Councillors and its officers. Thank you to Kevin Jones and the Key Venues team for another outstanding year under difficult circumstances. We very much look forward to a more settled year in 2020/2021 and continuing to work together for our community.

CEO's message

It would be remiss of me not to start this message without recognising the tremendous group of people I have the honour of working alongside. The dreadful bushfire season that befell the country during the summer months followed closely by the COVID-19 outbreak produced a second half of the year that was challenging to say the least. The team at Council and BVM have responded magnificently. I feel privileged to be a part of that team and I have watched with admiration as Council's leadership has guided us through these dark days to a brighter future ahead. To the BVM Chairman and Blacktown Mayor Tony Bleasdale OAM, to our Deputy Chairman Mr Kerry Robinson OAM, to our Councillors and Council's Executive and to the BVM Directors I thank you on behalf of all staff for your continued leadership and support. What a year for our first term Chairman!

Despite these challenges the team at BVM still produced a memorable 2019/2020. Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney (BISP) hosted 3,915 events and over 400,000 visitors came through our gates. We continued to make our mark on the international sporting stage with 13 international teams from various codes and countries including Japan, Korea and New Zealand descending on the Sportspark for training and competition. Once again, we played host to a number of exciting sports events including the Softball Australia Pacific Cup, the Summer Slam Softball Series, the Marsh Community AFL Series, the 2020 Wheelchair NSW Summer Down Under road racing series, training for the ICC Women's T20 World Cup, the LG Twins Korean Baseball Club and the Chinese Taipei Women's Football team in Sydney for an Olympic qualifying game.

A particular highlight of this year was the official opening of the Western Sydney Wanderers 'Centre of Football'. This marked a project 8 years in the making and which has created probably the best football (soccer) training facility in the country. The partnership between the Wanderers and Council goes from strength to strength with the Centre of Football the envy of rival football clubs.

What a memorable year it has been for Blacktown Venue Management!

The development of the BISP International Centre of Excellence (ICTE) continues to evolve and I was pleased to welcome Dr Neil Gibson as the new Director of the ICTE. In partnership with the Australian Catholic Universities (ACU), Blacktown Hospital, Sydney West Sports Medicine and many others the ICTE will be an internationally-renowned facility and will be the centrepiece of the Sportspark.

Our leisure and aquatic facilities also had an eventful year with over 1,800,000 visitors despite a number of days being lost due to the bushfires and COVID-19. Our venues hosted numerous school carnivals, the annual Family Sportsfest, the Mount Druitt Festival and many community celebrations. During the close-down the BVM staff have worked incredibly hard to stay connected with our customers and the local community through information bulletins, social media posts and E-blasts. Re-opening our centres in June brought welcome relief and joy that we could once again serve our community.

Earlier this year we sadly lost one of our dearest team members - Ms Dani Gordon. Dani was involved in a tragic accident from which she never recovered. Her loss was felt deeply across Key Venues and the wider Council family. My deepest condolences go out to Dani's family and the many friends and colleagues impacted by her passing.

I would also like to pay tribute to Mr Graeme Watson, a former professional sportsman in cricket and AFL and who worked very closely with us in the earlier days of BVM. Graeme lost his battle against cancer earlier this year but his legacy lives on amongst the magnificent Olympic legacy venues at BISP that Graeme helped transfer from Olympic oversight to Council custodianship.

Finally, I would like to personally thank the Chairman, Deputy Chairman and the Blacktown Venue Management Directors for their advice, guidance and support over the past 12 months. We are excited about what the future holds and we look forward to the year ahead.

In addition to WHS policy, all Key Venues leisure and aquatic facilities work closely with Royal Life Saving Australia and operate within the Guidelines for Safe Pool operations. Blacktown Aquatic Centre, Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton, Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope, Mount Druitt Swimming Centre and Riverstone Swimming Centre have all received 5 Star Water Safety Partner accreditation from Royal Life Saving. This accreditation demonstrates the facilities commitment to aquatic safety standards.

This is a result of independent audit that reviews procedures and facility features. Our ongoing commitment water safety and education is further demonstrated through the promotion of Royal Life Saving's 'Keep Watch @ Public Pools' initiative. This initiative has key messages for parents on how they need to supervise their children in an aquatic environment.

Lifejackets are available across the 5 leisure and aquatic centres to provide additional safety for non or less confident swimmers. Since implementation there has been no major drowning incidences caused from a casualty struggling to swim. Staff continue to undertake professional development to provide the highest quality service with over 60 staff attending pool supervision training sessions.

This year a new live dashboard was implemented, digitalising the process of recording pool tests to ensure the plant rooms are run efficiently.

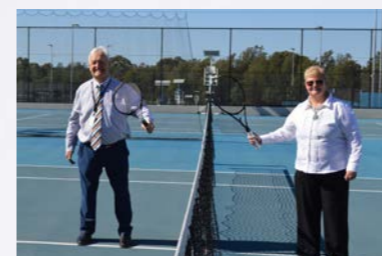

In July 2019 Super 6 High Performance became a part of the Sportspark family, holistically catering to all abilities for high performance regardless of sporting code.

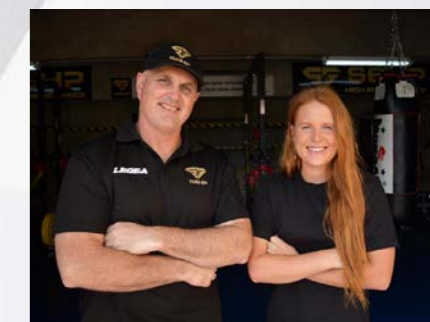

Blacktown Aquatic Centre is a modern, family friendly leisure and aquatic facility located in the heart of Blacktown. The centre's Olympic 50 metre lap pool is the top destination for swimming carnivals in Blacktown City and surrounds, for both schools and swimming clubs.

Blacktown Aquatic Centre hosted 44 swimming carnivals between December 2019 to March 2020. The centre also runs Council's Aqua Learn to Swim program continuing to teach children as young as 6 month old, all the way up to adults, the important life skill of learning to swim and water safety. The centre runs its all ability program to ensure all children learn these valuable water skills.

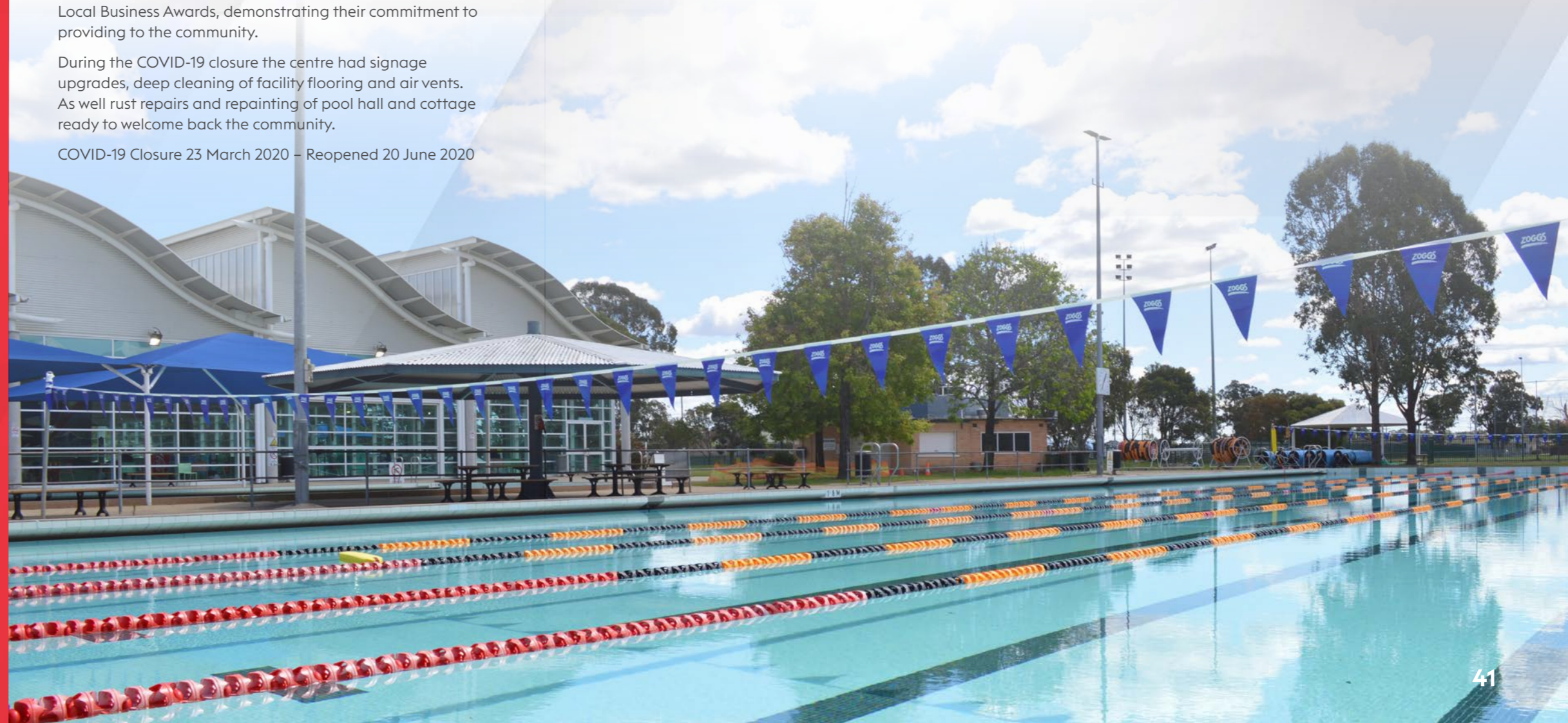
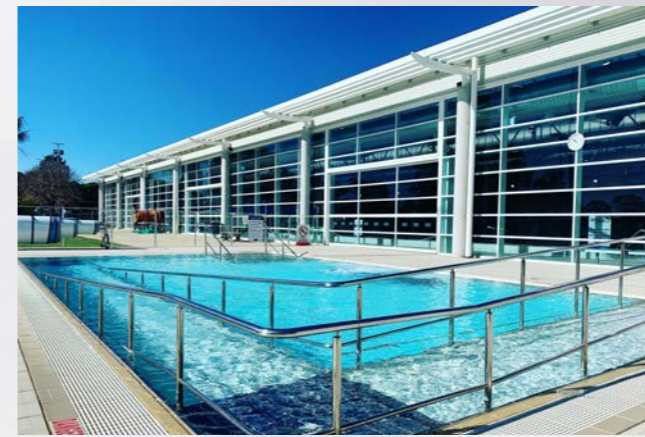

International Centre of Training Excellence

An international centre of training excellence is being developed within the Blacktown International Sportspark, Sydney with construction scheduled to start in quarter 3 of 2021.

The centre will include:

- ▶ Sports medicine
- ▶ Hydrotherapy
- ▶ Environmental chamber,
- ▶ Auditorium
- ▶ Café/dining.

In addition to the facilities within the building a new all-weather synthetic pitch will be built, a space that can be used by the local community and a range of sporting teams alike. We are working with key stakeholders including Higher Education, the Western Sydney Local Health District and sporting bodies to provide the local community with a facility and expertise that have a demonstrable benefit to health, fitness and sports performance.

The development will also include a new 100 bed accommodation block designed to host domestic and international sporting teams competing and training in and around the Blacktown International Sportspark.
