From full facility closures to re-opening under COVID restrictions, I am proud to be working alongside a team of people who have risen to every challenge thrown at them. To the leadership team and colleagues at Council, through to each and every person in the Key Venues 'family' I would like to say a sincere and hearty 'Thank you' for your unwavering support and continued commitment.

I am undoubtedly privileged to lead such a wonderful team and I have watched with admiration as Council's leadership has guided us through these dark days to a brighter future ahead. To the BVM Chairman and Blacktown Mayor Tony Bleasdale OAM, to our deputy chairman Mr Kerry Robinson OAM, to our Councillors, Council's Executive and to the BVM Directors I thank you on behalf of all Key Venues staff for your continued leadership and support.

Despite the many challenges in 2020/2021 there was also many memorable moments. Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney (BISP) hosted 5,464 events and over 460,500 visitors came through our gates. BISP celebrated the 20th anniversary of our involvement in the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games. To mark the occasion, Bronze and Silver medal winning softball player Fiona Crawford, Olympic baseballer Glenn Williams, Bob Fitzgerald, our local Police Commander at the time, Bob's wife, Kate, an Olympic volunteer and Mayor Bleasdale returned to the Olympic site and shared their fondest memories of September 2000.

BISP was also recognised on a national and international level with teams from AFL, A-League, Cricket and Supercars motor racing basing themselves at BISP in COVID quarantine training bubbles. During these time BISP was able to provide a place for these athletes and teams to train and prepare for competition safely and securely.

Among many highlights, 2 in particular stand-out this year. The Emerging Matildas made Blacktown their new 'home' at Blacktown Football Park for training and development ahead of the 2023 Women's World Cup and we welcomed Bachelor of Exercise & Sport Science and Bachelor of High-Performance Sport students from the Australian Catholic University (ACU) to its new home in the BISP Athletics Centre.

Our leisure and aquatic facilities also had an eventful year with over 1.2 million visitors despite a number of days lost due to COVID-19 closures. Council's flagship leisure facility, Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope was excited to welcome its 15 millionth visitor to the centre since opening its doors back in 2003. Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope and all of our other leisure and aquatic centres continue to provide the best sport, leisure and aquatic facilities for the community.

Community water safety and learning to swim continues to be a high priority for Blacktown City Council and for Blacktown Key Venues. We launched our Drowning Prevention Strategy late last year which brought together our ideas, programs and initiatives into a single cohesive driver focusing on drowning prevention in our community. The strategy establishes a clear vision for maintaining safe water environments and educating the community in water safety. And looking forward there is so much to be excited about and the future looks so bright. The International Centre of Training Excellence (ICTE) will start to take shape, a new 'splash pad' water fun park will be developed at Blacktown Aquatic Centre, new shade structures will provide sun protection for our visitors to Blacktown Aquatic Centre and Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton and we will once again play host to numerous activities and events.

2020/2021 has been an unforgettable year for a whole range of reasons – some ups and some downs. 2021/2022 promises many more ups than downs and an exciting year in prospect.

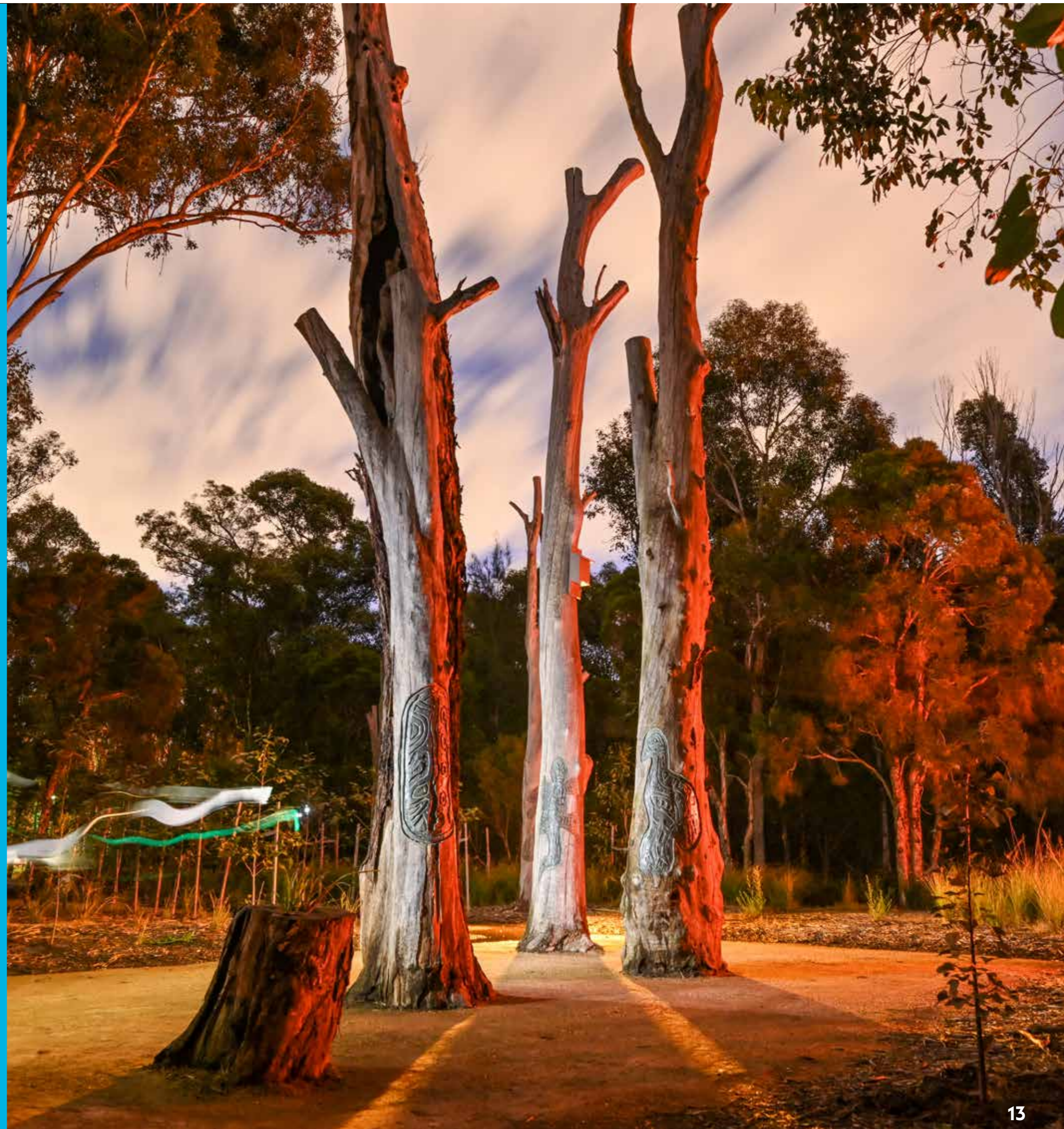

Blacktown Key Venues launched the Drowning Prevention Strategy in October 2020. The Key Venues Drowning Prevention Strategy reinforces Blacktown City Council's commitment to water safety and preventable drowning through strategic goals of:

- ▶ Education, advocacy and support
- ▶ Partnerships and network buildings
- ▶ Environment and technology.

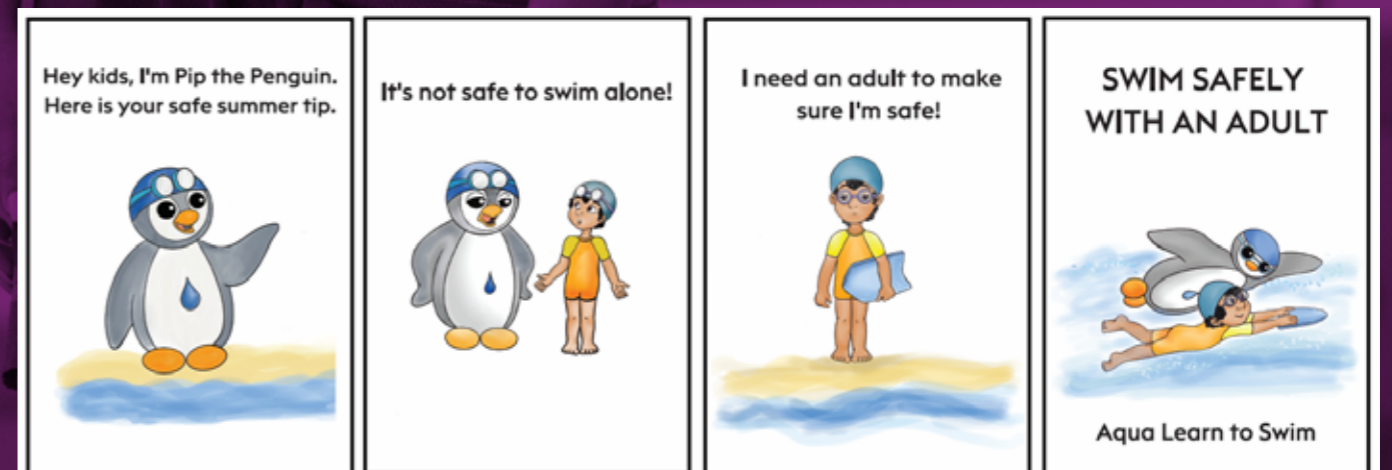
The aim of the strategy is to:

- ▶ provide quality program and services that support water safety and drowning prevention in the community
- ▶ Provide safe aquatic venues with a low accident rate
- ▶ Follow aquatic industry best practices.

Our ongoing commitment to water safety and education is further demonstrated through the promotion of Royal Life Saving's 'Keep Watch @ Public Pools' initiative. This initiative has key messages for parents on how they need to supervise their children in an aquatic environment.

Lifejackets are available across the 5 leisure and aquatic centres to provide additional safety for non or less confident swimmers. Since implementation there has been no major drowning incidences caused from a casualty struggling to swim.

Blacktown Key Venues was a finalist in the 2020 Parks and Leisure Australia NSW/ACT Awards of Excellence in 'Best Use of Technology' category for the Live dashboard/digitalised pool water quality initiative.

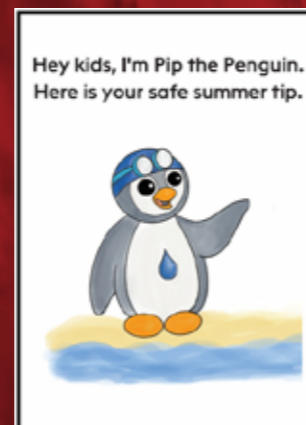

Since the development of the site since the 2000 Sydney Olympic games, the Sportspark boasts its first-class sporting facilities for athletics, Australian rules football, baseball, cricket, football, professional goalkeeping development and softball.

The Sportspark continues to grow its earned reputation as an elite, established and all-inclusive multi-sport and community venue with its leading facilities utilised by community grassroots to professional players. The park continues to support sport at all levels with just under half a million athletes, spectators and officials visiting the Sportspark this year. But also supported and celebrated the community by holding the Blacktown City Parkfest Festival.

15 September 2020 marks 20 years since Blacktown hosted the world at the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games. Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney, formerly Blacktown Olympic Park, was the training and playing venue for the Baseball and Softball competitions and the training venue for athletics before and during the Olympic Games. Athletics Centre

The Athletics Centre is an elite athletics training facility home to athletes of all levels, abilities and ages for athletics, high performance and education. The Athletics Centre remains to be the number 1 destination in Western Sydney for school athletics and zone carnivals, athletics training and community events due to the outstanding facilities on offer. The Athletics Centre is the place to be for novices to professional athletes and enthusiasts.

Blacktown International Sportspark welcomed Australian Catholic University to their home at the Athletics Centre for their physiology units within their Bachelor of Exercise & Sport Science and Bachelor of High-Performance Sport programs. The first intake of students arrived 1 March 2021. The space is equipped with specialist bikes, treadmills, gas analysers, and isometric dynamometers to provide students with knowledge and skills to become accredited Exercise scientists.

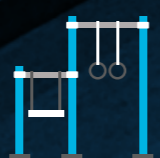

A visionary new master plan for the Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney, including a public square, hotel, athlete hostel, food and beverage facilities, transport, and traffic connections.



International Centre of Training Excellence

A new international centre of training excellence is being built in the Blacktown International Sports Park and will open in Quarter 1 of 2023.

The centre will host facilities and expertise curated to enable our local community, along with national and international athletes, to benefit from environments and services designed to improve health and performance for individuals of all ages.

The International Centre for Training Excellence will include:

- ▶ biomechanics laboratory for analysing kicking, throwing and striking actions
- ▶ a 60 metre analysis track for gait, jumping and landing mechanic assessments
- ▶ physiology spaces for the assessment of body composition, blood profiles, lung function and cardiovascular fitness
- ▶ a strength and conditioning gym
- ▶ aquatics including a recovery pool and contrast (hot and cold) pools
- ▶ a sports medicine clinic
- ▶ a patient centred medical home
- ▶ rectangular pitches
- ▶ physical literacy area for children
- ▶ café
- ▶ auditorium
- ▶ team and individual changing rooms.

Services offered within the Centre by Blacktown City Council and our stakeholders include:

- ▶ gait analysis for post-operative patients
- ▶ general practitioner appointments
- ▶ counselling and psychology services
- ▶ multidisciplinary care and advice
- ▶ lung function assessments
- ▶ body composition assessments
- ▶ lower body CT scans
- ▶ strength training and rehabilitation
- ▶ recovery services
- ▶ dietary advice and support.

In addition to the facilities within the building a new all-weather synthetic pitch will be built, a space that can be used by the local community and a range of sporting teams alike. We are working with key stakeholders including Higher Education, the Western Sydney Local Health District and sporting bodies to provide the local community with a facility and expertise that have a demonstrable benefit to health, fitness and sports performance.

The development will also include a new 100 bed accommodation block designed to host domestic and international sporting teams competing and training in and around the Blacktown International Sportspark.

Stream of sustainability

This artwork pays homage to the lands of the Darug People, speaking to the sustainability of the local eco-system. The symbols in the mural represent local water plants and native wildlife. The blue central shape represents the flow of water and how it is a life-giving force that sustains native plants and wildlife, which in turn brings health to the eco-system of which we are all part. The Angus Creek Stormwater Harvesting and Reuse Scheme uses native water plants to filter and clean the stormwater before it is then used to irrigate the fields. Since the scheme was established wildlife has returned to the waterways and waterholes including turtles, birds and frogs; bringing health back to these waterways.
