Blacktown Venue Management Ltd is committed to work health and safety and follows Blacktown City Council's Work Health and Safety Policy as best practice. This policy requires due diligence in managing and providing a safe and healthy workplace for all. Its Key Venues leisure and aquatic facilities work closely with Royal Life Saving Australia and operate within the Guidelines for Safe Pool Operations. Staff are required to attend regular internal and external training to ensure they always meet the highest possible safety standards.


Royal Life Saving's Keep Watch @ Public Pools safety initiative, and the supervision guidelines included, are strictly enforced across all aquatic facilities as part of our ongoing commitment to water safety and education. The key messages of this initiative and the responsibilities of parents are communicated to patrons through a variety of mediums including television slides, multi-language signage, and a range of information pamphlets.

In 2024/25 we added multi-language audio recordings featuring our most important safety reminders. These recordings are targeted to the languages most commonly spoken by the local residents around each venue.

We continued to offer lifejackets for free use at our pools, a safety initiative popular with swimmers of all ages. Simple, visual signs help people wear them correctly.

In November 2024, Blacktown Key Venues held a Water Safety Awareness Forum at Blacktown Aquatic Centre to mark the International Day of People with Disability. The forum included a question and answer session led by Deputy Mayor of Blacktown, Councillor Bob Fitzgerald OAM, with respondents including 2024 Paralympian Silver Medallist Chloe Osborne, Blacktown Swim Club coach Matt Robinson, and aspiring Paralympians Ibrahim and Georgi. The forum acknowledged the unique struggles faced by swimmers with disability and the need for swimming lessons and programs to be accessible and suitable for all.

2024/25 highlights



July/August 2024:

- Blacktown Exercise Sports and Technology Hub received the President's Award and the Excellence in Design (non-residential) award in the **Urban Development Institute of Australia and Urban Property Group Awards**.



August:

- **Blacktown Family Fish In** at Mount Druitt Swimming Centre was attended by more than 600 people over 2 weekends.
- Australian Catholic University **Blacktown Swim Club swimmers**, Timothy Hodge and Chloe Osborn, represented Australia at the 2024 Paris Paralympics, bringing home 2 gold and 2 silver medals.



September:

- **Blacktown City Family Sportsfest** at Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope included stalls, activities and interactive displays from local sporting groups.



October:

- **Australian Aesthetic Group Gymnastic Federation** sent teams to compete at Hong Kong Cup International Rhythmic Gymnastics Invitation Championships with all 3 teams finishing in the top 5 in the finals.
- **Asia Pacific Dodgeball Invitational 2024** at Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope brought together over 1,200 players from 10 countries.
- **Blacktown Tennis Centre Stanhope** hosted the centenary celebrations of Blacktown Tennis Incorporated.



November:

- Blacktown Aquatic Centre hosted a Water Safety Awareness Forum to mark the **International Day for People with Disability** and the launch of the updated Pip's Safe Summer Tips booklet.
- The Mayor, Councillor Brad Bunting addressed the **Amazon Web Services Girl's Tech Day**.
- The **Chinese National Softball Federation team** visited the Blacktown International Sports Park and Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope to use the training facilities between international games.

December:

- Council's annual **Mount Druitt Pool Party** welcomed 300 people with a jumping castle, live music, food trucks and giveaways.
- The **Australian Rhythmic Gymnastics team** sent 12 students and 2 coaches to represent Australia in the Asia Pacific Cup and the United Cup International Competitions held in Christchurch, New Zealand. The team returned as Asia Pacific Cup champions (8 – 10 years) and runner-up champions (12 – 14 years) along with several podium medals and special awards.



January 2025:

- Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton unveiled its **new sprung-timber stadium floors** thanks to funding from Council and the NSW Government.



January/February:

- **4 Summer Sessions live music performances** from local musicians were held at Mount Druitt and Riverstone swimming centres over 2 weekends in January and February.



March:

- We celebrated the first Blacktown City Family Activefest at Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton with free entry and interactive sporting stalls.
- 220 people attended **Mount Druitt Swimming Centre's 50th anniversary** celebration featuring live music, dessert food trucks, a jumping castle, fishing games, giveaways and birthday cake.



April/May:

- Mount Druitt Swimming Centre and Blacktown Aquatic Centre hosted media launches for the upcoming redevelopment of the venues through the **Western Sydney Infrastructure Grants** programs. The launches unveiled the design concepts for public viewing.



June:

- **Blacktown City Sports Awards finalists** were announced including Blacktown Aquatic Centre squad coach Matt Robinson and Blacktown Swim Club member Tim Hodge.
- Tim Hodge won **Sportsperson of the Year** (people with a disability) at the 2025 Blacktown City Sports Awards.

Program highlights:

- More than 100 adults participated in the free 4-day Swim Sense water education program held at Blacktown Aquatic Centre, Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope and Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton.
- In July and August, our instructors delivered subsidised swimming lessons to 60 preschool aged students under Project Harmony, thanks to Royal Life Saving Society Australia funding.
- More than 1,000 students from 8 schools attended school swimming lesson programs run by the Aqua Learn to Swim team.

About the program

The Aqua Learn to Swim program was offered at 4 our key venues in 2024/25. The program provides swimming lessons that cover all levels and abilities for students from 6 months to adult.



Programs offered:

- Infant programs
- Preschool programs
- School aged programs
- Teen programs
- Adult programs
- Private lessons
- Swim Abilities lessons
- Aqua Swim Academy
- Acceler8 intensive school holiday program
- Carnival Readiness program
- Swim Sense.

The program ran for 46 weeks in 2024/25. During the 6-week summer holiday period, the regular program was replaced by a range of holiday programs, including Acceler8, Swim Sense and the Carnival Readiness program.

Project Harmony, a Royal Life Saving NSW initiative run across 3 of the aquatic and leisure centres, provided subsidised swimming lessons for preschool-aged children, with parents only needing to use their NSW Government First Lap voucher to access the program. The program was extended from its original 10-week term as a result of its popularity.

About the centre

Blacktown Aquatic Centre has remained a community favourite for over 60 years, welcoming almost 400,000 people in the last 12 months. It is one of the most popular locations for carnivals of all levels in our City.

In February 2025, Blacktown Swim Club participants and Blacktown Aquatic Centre members came together to swim 30,160 laps (1,508 kilometres) for the Starlight Foundation's Super Swim. Led by Starlight ambassador, Paralympian and Blacktown Swim Club member Chloe Osborn, swimmers raised money and awareness for the foundation to help sick kids across Australia.

The Centre is expected to close in 2026 for the renewed Blacktown Aquatic Centre project, funded by the Western Sydney Infrastructure Grants program. The \$77.2 million project will refresh and expand upon the existing facilities with:

- new 50-metre indoor pool
- 25-metre indoor program pool
- refurbished outdoor 20-metre pool
- refurbished health and fitness facilities
- updated café, foyer and reception spaces.

Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton has remained a favourite for all ages. The facility offers members and guests year-round access to services and amenities of the highest standard, including a warm water therapy pool for exercise recovery and rehabilitation.

Following on from exciting centre upgrades completed in 2023/24, the stadium courts were refurbished during November 2024 to January 2025. The stadium was transformed with new sprung-timber multisport flooring allowing the centre to host more sporting groups and competitions of all levels throughout the year. The project was jointly funded by Blacktown City Council and the NSW Government through the Clubgrants Category 3 Infrastructure Grants: Sport and Recreation program.

About the centre

Mount Druitt Swimming Centre has been a hub of activity in 2024/25, hosting a variety of celebrations throughout summer. The centre achieved an amazing milestone in March 2025, celebrating 50 years since opening its doors in 1975. The anniversary was marked with a party full of activities for all residents, including food trucks, live music, jumping castle, fishing games, giveaways and a huge cake.

Before opening for the season, we hosted the annual Blacktown Family Fish In with 600 community members attending over 2 weekends.
